The District has started its Reclaimed Water System – Phase I which will take treated water from the wastewater treatment plant, further process and disinfect it and then distribute it for irrigation. The purpose of this project is to reduce the District's dependency on purchased water and to minimize groundwater withdrawals. By using reclaimed water, the effects of subsidence can be minimized and ultimately the cost of water to you is reduced. The areas where the distribution pipelines are to be installed are shown in the attached Overall Layout. You will notice survey crews, construction personnel and equipment working throughout the neighborhood. Some of the pipes will be installed with open excavations and others will be augured. There will be inconveniences during this time and the contractor will work to limit them.
